26th Annual Sno-Ball Softball Tournament Scores for TLC

Tournament raises more than \$19,000 for Rockville-based TLC—The Treatment and Learning Centers

Rockville, MD. —TLC—The Treatment and Learning Centers, a local, private non-profit agency providing educational, vocational, and therapeutic services to children and adults with a range of disabilities and typically developing children, congratulates the winners of the *26th Annual Sno-Ball Softball Tournament*, played March 31st and April 1st at regional parks throughout Montgomery County, Maryland. A total of 69 registered teams from the Washington, DC metropolitan area participated in this charity event, raising more than \$19,000 for TLC—The Treatment and Learning Centers. The tournament was made possible through the sponsorship of Senate Insurance, who has been its primary supporter for more than a decade.

Since 1981, this tournament, the largest preseason softball event in the Washington area, has hosted over 1,000 teams competing in one of six divisions, including 1 co-recreational and 5 men's divisions. Each registered team was assigned to a designated field where they competed within 4- or 5-team brackets on the premier day of the event. On Sunday, April 1st, the top two teams from each division bracket played in the final division championship rounds. Trophies and tournament t-shirts were distributed to all first and second place teams. The 1st place team in each division will receive entry into the ASA (American Softball Association) Regional Tournament.

This year's 1st and 2nd place winners in each division are as follows: Men's B/Super C—Washington Auto Body and CE & Son Equipment Co.; Men's C—Big Ballers and Bonifant Bombers; Men's D—High Street Bucs 45+ and Express; Men's Senior's 50+—High Street Bucs 50+ and Munchbox Vending 50s; Men's Senior's 55+—Maryland Yutes and High Street Bucs 55+; and Regular Co-Recreational—R&L Carmichael Construction and Cenit Rent-A-Car. The High Street Bucs entered three teams in three divisions and won two out of three. They were the 2nd place finisher in the third division. The High Street Bucs Seniors 55+ won their division last year. This is the third year in a row that Carmichael and Cenit played the championship round in the co-rec division. Carmichael won in 2005, and Cenit won in 2006. Washington Auto Body, High Street Bucs 45+ and High Street Bucs 50+ all won the same divisions in 2005.

This tournament is a cooperative effort of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, Montgomery County Recreation Department, Rockville Parks and Recreation Departments, and the Greater Washington Softball Umpires Association. The annual SnoBall Tournament utilizes regional park fields at Cabin John, Ridge Road, Olney Manor, Fairland, Martin Luther King, Layhill Regional Parks, and Rockville's Broome Athletic Park.
