Crowds Converge for TLC's King of the Road 5K

Over 400 Raise \$20,000 for Rockville-Based TLC—The Treatment and Learning Centers

Rockville, Md.—On Sunday, November 15, clear skies and sunshine provided the backdrop for 400 runners and walkers from throughout the metro area who participated in TLC's *5th Annual King of the Road 5K Run/1 Mile Walk/Kid's Fun Run*. Presented by [King Automotive Group](#), the event raised \$20,000 to support more than 2,100 people served annually by [TLC—The Treatment and Learning Centers](#), a local, non-profit organization that provides educational, therapeutic, and vocational services to children and adults with special needs.

The three top **Male Overall** runners were **Andrew Jesien** of Rockville, who set a course record with a winning time of 14:52; **Abraham Nuetich**, of Mount Vernon, VA in 14:58, and **Abibiyot Abebe** of Washington, DC in 15:01. The three top **Female Overall** runners were **Margaret Infeld** and **Elizabeth Maloy**, both of Washington, DC and both with a winning time of 16:50, and **Elena Orlova** of Gaithersburg in 17:08. A year after his death, over 70 friends, family members, and colleagues of [Ian Wolfe](#) honored the young local runner from Arlington, VA who was killed October 5, 2008 in a tragic bicycle accident. For the second year, friends, coworkers and family chose TLC's King of the Road as the best charity race to honor his memory. "We are thrilled to partner with TLC and the *King of the Road* run as a way to celebrate our son Ian. Our friends and family get to participate in a quality well-run event and TLC benefits by the additional participants we bring to the run. This year the weather was perfect and it was a 'Great Day to Run,'" said John Wolfe, Ian's father.
